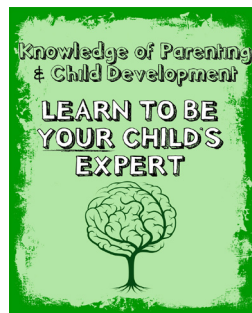
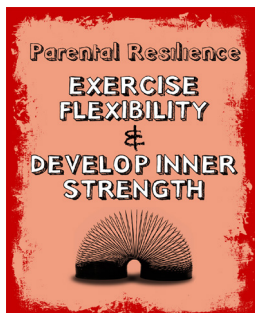
Bringing the Protective Factors Framework to Life in Your Work

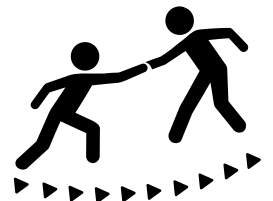
